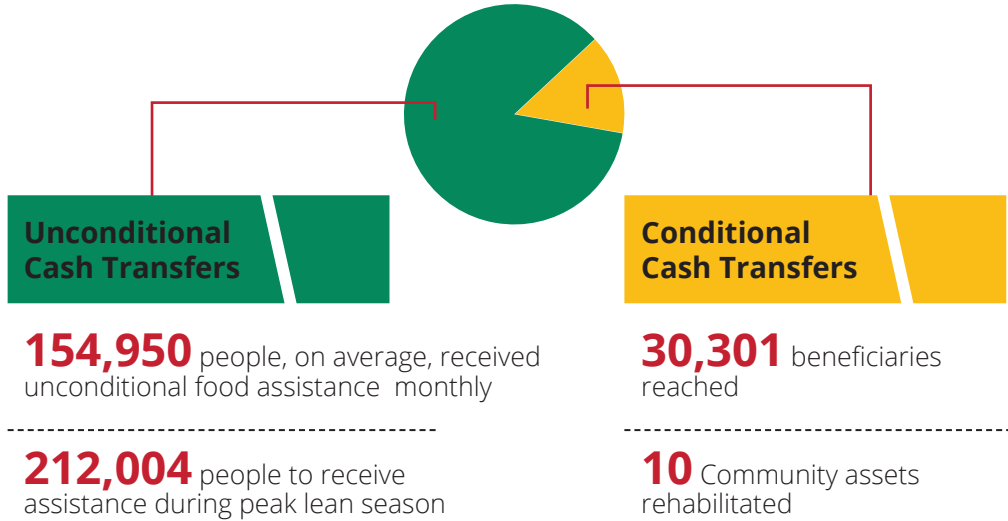

## ZIRP Overview: 31 March 2020



### Conditional & Unconditional Cash Transfers



### Restoring agricultural and livestock production



**1,754** tonnes of agricultural inputs distributed

**6,400** households received agricultural inputs

**5,914** beneficiaries trained on crop production



**3,621** beneficiaries are female-headed households



**107** farmers from 2 rehabilitated irrigation schemes trained in Agribusiness & Agronomy



**64** communal gardens identified and beneficiaries selected



**805** tonnes of stock feed for **2,981** breeding cattle procured & distributed to **1,073** households, including **303** female-headed households



**733** stock feed beneficiaries have been trained

**45** dip tanks identified for rehabilitation



**2,040,000** doses of Branthax & Lumpy Skin vaccines for cattle, **4,560,000** doses of New Castle Disease for **2.1 million** birds and **61,000** litres of de-wormer (**510,000** cattle, **500,000** goats & sheep) procured




**47,834** litres of dipping chemicals for 240 dip tanks distributed






Livestock inputs distribution has been delayed due to COVID-19




**1,073** beneficiaries reached










**World Health Organization**

	<b>1,818</b> people were sensitized on COVID-19, prevention of malnutrition, malaria & water borne diseases
	<b>33</b> village health workers trained on Integrated Disease Surveillance and Response (IDSR)
	<b>16</b> health workers were recruited including medical doctors, nurses, environmental, laboratory and pharmacy technicians for the mobile clinic teams
	<b>6,475</b> people received healthcare services
	<b>7</b> mission hospitals in Chimanimani and Chipinge received supervision support

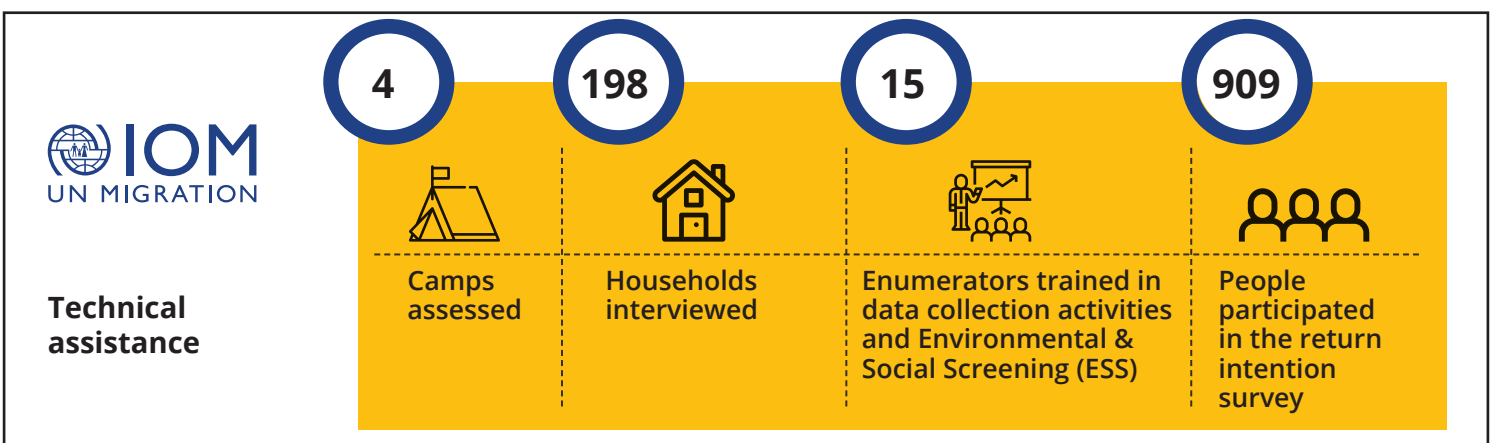
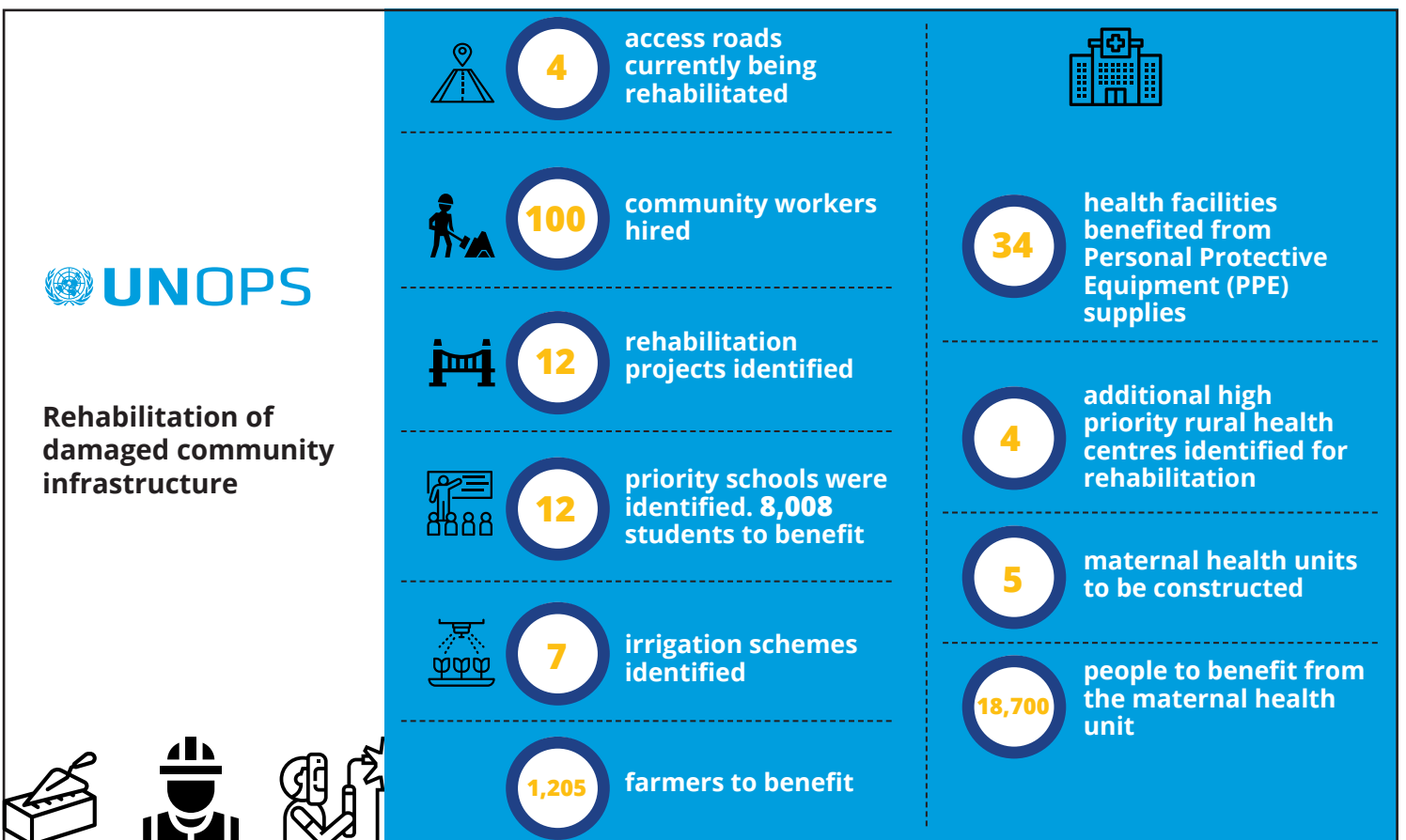
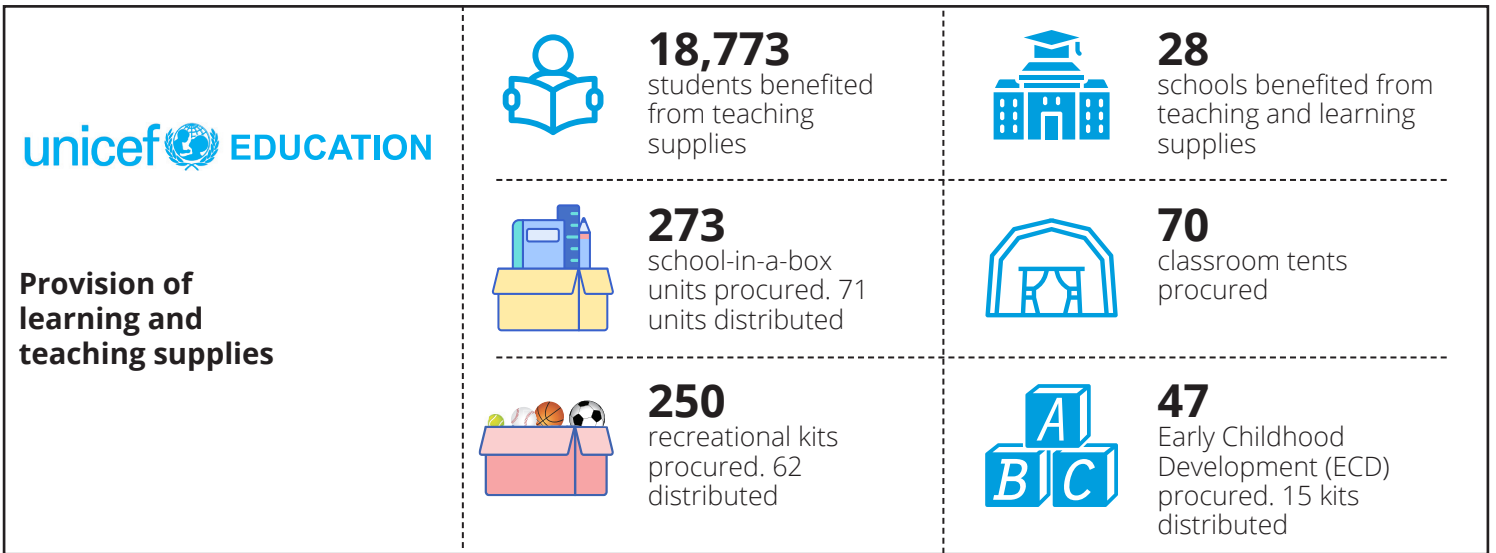
	<b>162</b> village health workers completed training
	<b>81</b> village health workers currently undergoing training in Chipinge & Chimanimani on COVID-19, key messages & Infection Prevention Control at home
	<b>18</b> Capacity-strengthening sessions conducted for Health Centre Committees (HCCs)
	<b>400</b> bicycles procured for village health workers
	<b>24,640</b> beneficiaries received essential community-based health, nutrition and population services
	<b>21,755</b> children under 5 were screened for malnutrition
	<b>33,528</b> women sensitized through home visits

	<b>8</b> partners identified to implement WASH interventions
	<b>31</b> high priority Wards targeted for WASH interventions
